the St. Agnes Parish Center from 3:00pm to 7:30pm to contribute. As part of this initiative, all blood donors will receive a voucher for a complimentary beverage at The Tap Room in Rockville Centre to be redeemed on May 16th.

This campaign aims to encourage blood donations during the summer months, as these months create challenges for blood supply due to school closures and family vacations.

Currently, the blood supply remains at a 3-4-day level, with a particular need for **Type O negative** (O-). While some causes demand sweat and tears, **Pint for Pint** is one the Friends of Mercy are willing to bleed for because the New York Blood Center is undeniably saving lives.
